Introduction

This edition of the FGSA newsletter provides an overview of events at the upcoming APS March meeting that are sponsored by FGSA or of interest to FGSA members. FGSA is sponsoring a panel discussion on non-traditional careers for physicists. The Forum is also co-sponsoring two additional sessions entitled .Where is the Center of Mass for Family, Career, and Self?. (co-sponsored with the Committee on the Status of Women in Physics) and .Lessons Learned from Katrina: How to Prepare a Department for Catastrophic Events. (co-sponsored with the Forum on Physics and Society).

There are also a number of receptions and networking events of interest to FGSA members which are described here. Members close to graduation will find the career workshops and activities outlined in this issue particularly useful.

Panel Discussion on Non-traditional Careers for Physicists

FGSA will be sponsoring a panel discussion on non-traditional careers for physicists. This session (Session S7) is scheduled for Wednesday, March 12 from 2:30 to 5:30pm at the Morial Convention Center . RO5. Invited speakers include Don Engel, who will discuss scientific careers in public policy; Manolis Antonoyiannakis and Daniel Ucko will talk about editorial and publishing jobs for physicists, drawing on personal experiences; and Frankie Wood-Black will discuss transitioning into the corporate and industrial sectors. The panel discussion will follow the invited speakers. This will be a valuable session for all FGSA members close to graduation and/or interested in non-academic track careers.

CSWP/FGSA co-sponsored Event: .Where is the Center of Mass for Family, Career, and Self?.

The Committee on the Status of Women in Physics (CSWP) and FGSA are co-sponsoring a session (Session J5) to discuss issues related to balancing family needs with career goals. The session is scheduled for Tuesday, March 11 from 11:15am to 1:40pm and will be held in the Morial Convention Center RO1. Greg Steab (U of New Orleans), Natalia Sidorovskaia (U of Louisiana . Lafayette), and David Hoagland (UMass Amherst). The speakers will give presentations from 11:15 to 12:45 followed by a panel discussion.
